








Respondents were ask to use a scale from 1 to 5, to answer how much do they personally agree or disagree to each statement. the answers were compiled and averaged: males vs females

































OVERALL, THE DATA SUGGESTS A NUANCED INTERPLAY BETWEEN CHANGING SOCIETAL PERCEPTIONS OF GENDER ROLES AND THE ECONOMIC REALITIES THAT EDUCATED MALE RESPONDENTS, IN PARTICULAR, ARE FACING. THE PERCEPTIONS ARE NOT STRAIGHTFORWARD NOR ONE-DIMENSIONAL BUT RATHER INFLUENCED BY VARIOUS FACTORS, FROM NATURE TO NURTURE AND EVERYTHING IN BETWEEN.

THE INSIGHTS REFLECT AN EVOLVING AWARENESS OF THE IMPORTANCE OF GENDER EQUALITY, FINANCIAL CONTRIBUTIONS, AND SHARED RESPONSIBILITIES WITHIN HOUSEHOLDS, ESPECIALLY DURING TIMES OF ECONOMIC UNCERTAINTY WHICH LEBANON HAS BEEN WITNESSING.

GIVEN THAT THE MAJORITY OF RESPENDENTS ARE HIGHLY EDUCATED AND MARRIED, THERE NEED AND ACKNOLEDGENMENT FOR THE ROLES OF BOTH GENDERS, AND MAINLY THAT OF WOMEN IS NOTABLE. WE ARE MORE AND MORE LIVING IN A SOCIETY THAT REQUIRES THAT CAN ONLY FLOURISH WITH BOTH GENDERS CONTRIBUTING TO IT




PERCEPTION ON THE ROLES WOMEN WOULD SUCCEED IN




I DON'T CONSIDER MARRIAGE MORE NECESSARY FOR WOMEN

















OVERALL, THE DATA UNDERSCORES A TREND TOWARDS A MORE EQUITABLE DISTRIBUTION OF PARENTING ROLES WITHIN THE HOUSEHOLD, REFLECTING A CHANGING SOCIETAL LANDSCAPE WHERE BOTH PARENTS ARE ACTIVELY ENGAGED IN VARIOUS ASPECTS OF RAISING CHILDREN.

- Both male and female respondents largely emphasize shared responsibilities in various parenting tasks, signaling a shift towards collaborative parenting roles.
- While there's alignment on shared roles in education, emotional support, and organizing recreational activities, differing perceptions emerge in areas like providing financial support and daily care.
- Women respondents appear to emphasize shared responsibilities across the board, while men respondents show variance, particularly in areas where traditional gender roles might have a stronger historical influence.
- The data highlights a positive trend towards greater participation of women in parenting tasks, underscoring evolving perceptions and a move away from traditional gender roles.
- It's evident that the perceptions of both male and female respondents are influenced by their personal experiences, societal norms, and changing dynamics in the modern world.





Around half the respondents, regardless of gender perceive women's role currently to extend beyond the household. Being at the extremes of genders, it shows that more of males consider that women are currently seeking personal and professional growth and moving away from the traditional roles than females!


PERCEPTION OF BOTH GENDERS REGARDING WHAT THE ROLES OF WOMEN SHOULD BE IN SOCIETY TODAY



A significant divergence arises when envisioning the preferred roles of women in the future. While 77% of male respondents believe that women's roles should extend beyond the household, an unexpected finding is that only 42% of female respondents share this view.

- Conversely, 55% of female respondents prefer women to seek personal and professional growth and step away from traditional roles as wives and mothers, while only 16% of male respondents hold this perspective.

CONCLUSION & MORE

THE STUDY ILLUMINATES THE EVOLVING PERCEPTIONS OF MEN AND WOMEN TOWARDS WOMEN'S ROLES IN SOCIETY, REVEALING A LANDSCAPE OF CHANGE AND POTENTIAL. WHILE STRIDES HAVE BEEN MADE TOWARDS EQUALITY, NUANCES PERSIST. MEN AND WOMEN'S ASPIRATIONS FOR THE FUTURE HIGHLIGHT EVOLVING NORMS, BUT ALSO REVEAL DISPARITIES ROOTED IN SOCIETAL EXPECTATIONS. IN THIS JOURNEY TOWARDS EQUITY, THE RECOGNITION OF SHARED CAPABILITIES, OPENNESS TO CHANGE, AND EMPOWERMENT PLAY CRUCIAL ROLES.

THE LANDSCAPE TARGETED IN THIS STUDY, HIGHLIGHTS THAT HIGHER EDUCATION, INVOLVEMENT IN SOCIETY AND ECONOMIC CONTRIBUTION IS DIRECTLY CORRELATED TO ACQUIRING NEW PERCEPTION AND RETAINING A FLXIBLE MINDSET TOWARDS THE ROLE OF WOMEN, ESPECIALLY AMONG MEN GIVEN THE CURRENT ERA AND COUNTRY SITUATION

WHILE MEN SEEMINGLY SUPPORT WOMEN'S ROLES IN SOCIETY, THE DATA DISCLOSES A DIVERGENCE IN THEIR VISION FOR WOMEN'S FUTURE ENDEAVORS. IT BECOMES EVIDENT THAT A SIGNIFICANT PROPORTION OF MEN, WHILE ACKNOWLEDGING WOMEN'S PRESENCE, RESIST THE IDEA OF WOMEN PURSUING PERSONAL AND PROFESSIONAL GROWTH, VEERING AWAY FROM TRADITIONAL ROLES. THIS UNDERLYING SENTIMENT UNDERSCORES THE COMPLEXITIES OF SOCIETAL NORMS AND EXPECTATIONS, SIGNALING THAT PROGRESS IS NOT UNIFORM ACROSS ALL ASPECTS OF GENDER ROLES. THUS, THE STUDY REVEALS A TALE OF APPARENT ALIGNMENT MASKING UNDERLYING DIFFERENCES IN PERSPECTIVES ON WOMEN'S ASPIRATIONS FOR CHANGE AND GROWTH.
